Dream India Mission Trip

December 13-23, 2018

This year's Dream India trip will take place December 14-23 and the team is facilitating two projects for the mission in India.

1. **Backpacks:** Just as we did last year we are purchasing backpacks for 'slum' children in Bhubaneswar, India. Each backpack costs roughly \$20 and is filled with school supplies, blankets, toiletries and even some essential clothing. We get more for our money by purchasing these in India, so we are raising the funds for these and Sunny Raul will purchase and assemble them. We will distribute them as a team to these children when we arrive. Our goal is to purchase 200 of these and we have already raised \$500 of the \$4,000 total.
2. **Audio Bibles:** We would like to bless the tribal pastors with audio Bibles as most of them are illiterate. This essential tool provides them with the Bible in both Hindi and Orya and allows them to share the gospel without first having to learn to read. One Bible with charger and headphones is \$50. and Sunny is asking for 20 of them. Our total goal is 20 @ \$50 each = \$1,000.
